# **ABOUT THE BOOK**

Senior Kindergarten Children at Redbricks Junior (4.5 to 6.0 year olds) conducted a 5-week research project on the theme of "Outdoor Play Equipment" in September-October 2016. This book is a collection of illustrations and stories created by children in the process of sharing their experiences and imagination related to outdoor play.

At Redbricks, we firmly believe in the value of Play for young children. We integrate learning through play and seek to make all adults aware to let children Play for their own benefit. The process of learning at our pre-school is child-centric, with emergent Project Based Learning methodology.

During this project, children were engaged in visualizing and creating their own outdoor equipment for the school garden. They created a bamboo tree house structure with other components such as a tyre climber, a bamboo ladder, a tunnel slide and a hanging bridge.

This project culminated through an exhibition at Kanoria Art Gallery, Ahmedabad showcasing children's thinking and work for the adults of the community. This book is an evidence of the high potential of young children, if allowed to express, emote, ideate and create about issues close to their hearts.

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# **FOREWORD**

I often try to recollect my childhood experiences and wonder why do I hold such vivid memories of some play experiences that seem so mundane to me now as an adult! I associate many places, people, smells, sights, feelings, etc., with a lot of my childhood play experiences. One of my favorite Play times was doing the morning Puja rituals with my Grandmother, and another was to clean the house when the house help was on leave! These and many other memorable play experiences helped me to engage my heart, head and hands into an activity of my own choice and liking. I had the freedom to design my play the way I wanted, without any structure or imposed boundaries.

Our young children today also need and thrive on such an environment. They become stronger, wiser, and happier when provided with such free, unstructured play experiences. Reading the play stories with illustrations of these young children in this book left me awestruck! I was amazed with the variety of aspects that children brought into their stories- people in their lives, places they like, other living things they are connected with, natural phenomena, emotions and relationships, all found a place in their stories. There is a treasure house within young children from where they can express deep understanding of the world around them, due to their own prior experiences and intuition. They can teach us how to look (or re-look) at the world from a different perspective!

These illustrations and stories are completely an original work of children, as a response to a simple question-"Share your experiences of outdoor play." The stories were told in Hindi and English, which were noted down by the teachers behind the drawings. These have been translated and edited slightly to make them readable to all readers. The language has purposefully not been refined to a greater degree, to allow for authenticity in representing children's thoughts and expressions.

I am left truly impressed by the original thinking and emotions expressed by children in this book. I hope this book brings a smile on the face of readers of all ages, and gives everyone a peep into young children's world of Play.

# OUR PROJECT JOURNEY "OUTDOOR PLAY EQUIPMENT"

This project was conducted through a design thinking process which involved stages such as – researching, visualizing, prototyping, creating, sharing and reflecting.

## RESEARCHING

At the start, children shared their prior experiences about Play and using Outdoor play equipment. They explored various outdoor play equipment in the school campus, and shared about various body movements used to play on them. Later, we went for a field trip to a private house garden (Ms. Nirali Patel) and Karnavati club children's park where they could explore a tree house, different types of slides, swings and climbing ladders. They explored the dimensions of these equipments through measurements and materials used to make them (wood, metal, plastic rope etc.). They made representational drawings, did etching, counting and tally marking at the sites. They interviewed people at the site regarding the process of installation of these equipments.

#### VISUALIZING

After the field trip, children came up with various ideas regarding the kind of outdoor play equipment they would like to create for the school garden.

These ideas included making – A Tree House, Slides, Swings, Monkey Bar, Merry Go Around, Tunnel, Rock Climbing Wall, Water slides, See Saw, etc.

We held class discussions and debates to finalize the final components of our outdoor equipment. The final components decided were – 1) A Tree House with a Bridge, 3) Tunnel Slide, 4) Tyre Climbing, 5) Rope Climbing, 6) Rope Ladder, 7) Round Tunnel Slide.

Children were shown photos and videos regarding processes of making outdoor equipments using indigenous materials. They represented their ideas of these components and the overall structure by making clay models and drawings. The teachers collectively created a final blueprint based on children's ideas.

Children made a work plan which described the materials and the processes of making the model. We divided children into five small groups according to their interest of making the component. With children, we decided on various materials to be used. (bamboos, sticks, rope, tyres, wires, etc.)





Diya: "We will need wood, old tyres and other material to create a tree house".

Hia: "We will use Aerolite to fix it".

Shivika: "We will colour the tree house using paints".

#### **PROTOTYPING**

Children were unsure how they could make the various components. So we showed them videos on the processes of making a tree house and other components. They saw various techniques such as how to tie the knot for climbing frame and ladder. They created prototypes out of clay models and indigenous materials (ropes, boxes, etc.) to visualize their bigger model.





#### **CREATING**

Children started working on their final components. While creating final products, they faced many challenges - e.g. tying bamboos, tying knot for the ladder and climbing frame. Children also shared that they needed help of the carpenter in making big model of the tree house in order to make it strong. The base of the tree house was created with bamboos and sticks. The wall of the tree house was made using canvas and plastic curtain sheets, which were drawn and painted colourfully by children.

Children made tyre climbing, ladder, and rope climbing components with teachers' and carpenter's guidance. During the process, children also interacted with Ms. Mirali Amin (Furniture Designer) over Skype for their queries regarding using Bamboos to create their equipment.





All small groups then started assembling their work collectively, and were really excited to see the outcome of their model.





#### SHARING AND REFLECTING

To share their learning and experiences, children prepared a story narration on the project. They selected the work done by them to be displayed and the whole project got recalled, reviewed and evaluated. As teachers, we were amazed with children's focus and concentration in applying difficult techniques of tying the ropes on bamboos for base of the tree house, ladder and rope climbing. All in all, the project was truly enriching which has developed their thinking, problem solving and creative abilities immensely.
